 - i. The West Metro Fire Protection District (District) deployed an additional 24-hour medic unit at Station 8 in order to:
 - 1. Add an additional medic to the Station 7, 8, and 10 area. This medic unit can also respond throughout the District.
 - 2. Support reliability of the effective response force (ERF) in the core of the District.
 - 3. Support work-life balance through decreased UHU of medics in the Station 7, 8, and 10 response area.
 - 4. Enhance opportunities for overtime attraction by decreasing the workload on busier medic units. (Exhibit 1)
 - ii. Medic 17 was temporarily relocated to Station 16 due to construction at Station 17 from June 8, 2023, through April 9, 2024.
- 5. Have there been any changes in programs/services? Yes
 - a. If yes, describe the changes and the impact to the community. Provide any exhibits to support your discussion.
 - i. The Recruit Candidate Selection (RCS) Committee met numerous times throughout 2023 in order to refine and recommend updates to the RCS Charter Document. This document defines the recruiting and hiring practices for uniform personnel at the District. These recommendations were voted on and adopted by the West Metro Fire Protection District Civil Service Committee. This initiative also supports one of the recommendations from the most recent accreditation report (2022), which stated, "It is recommended the agency continue to work towards its efforts to diversify the workforce to be reflective of the community in which it serves." These items are outlined in Exhibit 2 with some of the major changes being the removal of EMT certification requirement prior to hire, implementing a remote written test, developing and launching a new social media campaign, offering a new testing cycle for every academy, offering applications and physical agility testing at no cost, and adding a minimum passing score to the oral board process.
 - ii. Due to increased workload in the Fleet Maintenance Division, an additional mechanic position was added in 2023. This position was hired in order to decrease apparatus out-of-service times and to ensure availability of readily available apparatus reserves. (Exhibit 3 Page 36 and Exhibit 4 Page 14)
 - iii. Due to an increase in plan reviews, an additional civilian plans examiner was added to the Life Safety Division in order to decrease plan review completion times and meet the needs of new development within District boundaries. (Exhibit 4 Page 16)
 - iv. With assistance from a grant, the District was able to add a wildfire mitigation specialist in 2023. The grant assists with salary and benefits for three years, after which time the District plans to support the continuation of the position. (Exhibit 4 Page 11)
 - v. An administrative assistant in the Administration Division was added in order to assist with coverage of Civil Service Committee meetings, manage the administrative workload at the

- District, and meet the needs of the ninth recommendation which states, "It is recommended the agency develop a formal tracking mechanism to assure all agency agreements are reviewed at least every three years." (Exhibit 4 Page 12)
- vi. On May 28, 2024, the District Board of Directors adopted the West Metro Fire Rescue Strategic Plan 2024 Edition. While not applicable to reporting for 2023, this evolution of the Strategic Plan necessitates an interruption in the District's hosting of Strategic Plan Tracking on the District's website. (Exhibit 5)
